<p>Ask neighbour's advice on a diseased plant you have. Invite in for afternoon tea. Begin regular dialogue about gardening.</p>	<p>Encourage growing disciple to use their hospitality skills by hosting activities at their home.</p>
<p>Invite neighbour to a bbq at home with some church friends. Continue invitations and accept reciprocal invitations.</p>	<p>Meet for regular coaching as your friend begins leadership of a new neighbourhood cell group</p>
<p>Invite neighbour to a Christianity Explained info supper. Offer to attend the course with them.</p>	

<p>Advertise your playgroup in the local community newspaper, including a phone number for further information.</p>	<p>Invite playgroup friend to mid-week growth group where you study the Bible and pray for each other.</p>
<p>Respond warmly to a phone inquiry by asking questions about needs and expectations, and make an appointment for a guided tour of the playgroup.</p>	<p>Christian playgroup mums have a weekly phone coaching appointment to discuss ministry progress and pray for each other.</p>
<p>Introduce newcomer to a church member, who intentionally builds friendship and introduces to other mums at Playgroup.</p>	<p>Playgroup team leaders meet monthly to renew vision, share ministry issues and pray together.</p>
<p>Conduct a brief Alpha promotion at playgroup. Church members offer to attend Alpha course with unchurched mums.</p>	

<p>Kids from the youth group sign up to play with a local basketball team. Parents drive kids to games.</p>	<p>Believers gather weekly in a coffee house to discuss Christian classics like Coleman's <i>Master Plan for Evangelism</i>.</p>
<p>Church kids develop friendships with unchurched kids. Parents follow kids relationships and foster friendships with other parents.</p>	<p>Disciples complete the 'shape' course, and commit to serving in various ministries according to the results.</p>
<p>Church kids invite new friends to youth camp. Parents invite new friends' families on camping weekends with church families.</p>	<p>A six-monthly leadership retreat allows time for spiritual reflection, renewal and future planning.</p>
<p>Kids invite interested friends to lunchtime discussion group around the film <i>The Revolutionary</i>. Parents invite interested friends to study Luke via <i>Jesus</i> video.</p>
